Voters have approved a \$1.2 billion package that largely focuses on Fort Worth Independent School District's aging middle schools.

The 2021 Bond program will provide major interior renovations throughout to accommodate FWISD education specifications. Examples of work include new, secured front-entry vestibules for schools, upgrades of corridors, common areas, media centers, and cafeteria spaces for student collaboration, and refitted science labs and modified classrooms to meet space requirements. In most cases, portables will be removed and there will be building additions for various campus needs.







Earl joined the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in December of 2002 in Fort Worth, TX Regional Office with the Office of Fair Housing and Equal Opportunity (FHEO). Earl promoted into management in FHEO in January of 2011, and he promoted again soon after in May of 2012 to the position of Field Office Director (FOD) in Omaha, NE with the Office of Field Policy and Management (FPM). In November 2021, Earl assumed the duties as the Fort Worth FOD. His professional growth and development at HUD are paralleled with a 25-year military service record with the U.S. Army, retiring at the highest enlisted rank of Sergeant Major. Earl holds a BA and MBA from Dallas Baptist University (DBU), and he is currently a PhD candidate at DBU studying the intersection of public policy, leadership, and race. He is a trained mediator and facilitator, and he is an Excellence In Government (EIG) Fellow. In addition to his current academic pursuits, Earl engages with his local community outside of his HUD duties, serving as an Adjunct Professor, a facilitator with the Anti-Defamation League (ADL), and a mentor.



### Office of Public and Indian Housing Role

• The role of the Office of Public and Indian Housing (PIH) is to ensure safe, decent, and affordable housing; create opportunities for residents' self-sufficiency and economic independence; and assure fiscal integrity by all program participants.



#### OFFICE OF PUBLIC & INDIAN HOUSING

### **Examples of What Is Being Accomplished**

- Public and Indian Housing Program: \$315.5 million awarded in Fiscal Year 2022; 96.37% of the funds have been disbursed to housing authorities. The desired outcome is 100% by January 31, 2023.
- Public Housing Capital Fund: \$244.3 million awarded in Fiscal Year 2022; 10.16% of the funds have been disbursed to housing authorities. The desired outcome is 100% by May 11, 2026.
- Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers Program: \$2.0 billion in Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) funding awarded in Fiscal Year 2022; 98.36% of the HAP funding was utilized by agencies in Calendar Year 2022; the desired outcome is ≥ 98% for Calendar Year 2022.
- Family Self-Sufficiency Program: \$8.3 million awarded in Fiscal Year 2021; 82% of the funds have been expended by the housing authorities; the desired outcome is 100% by January 31, 2023

## What is Multifamily Housing?


- HUD multifamily housing comprises rental properties with 5 or more dwelling units, such as apartments buildings and cooperatives.
   Buildings can be garden-style, mid-rise, high-rise, or walk-ups, and may include scattered sites.
- Property Classifications:
  - Market Rate
  - Affordable (Subsidized or Assisted)
  - Mixed-Income (Market Rate and Affordable units)
- Residents:
  - Individuals
  - Families
  - Seniors
  - Persons with Disabilities

# Community Planning and Development Programs

Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) provides annual grants on a formula basis to entitled cities and counties to develop viable urban communities by providing decent housing and a suitable living environment and expanding economic opportunities. The CDBG Program is designed to principally benefit low- and moderate-income persons. States administer CDBG in non-entitled areas (mainly rural communities). Activities include funding critical infrastructural improvements, preserving housing stock for low- and moderate-income individuals, and creating economic opportunities for low- and moderate-income persons.

**HOME Investment Partnerships Program (HOME)** provides formula grant funds to States and localities, often used in partnership with local nonprofit groups, to fund a wide range of activities including building, buying, and/or rehabilitating affordable housing for rent or homeownership, or providing direct rental assistance to low-income people. HOME is the largest Federal block grant to state and local governments designed exclusively to create affordable housing for low-income households. HOME funds are awarded annually as formula grants to participating jurisdictions (PJs). The program's flexibility allows States and local governments to use HOME funds for grants, direct loans, rental assistance (or security deposits in lieu of), or loan guarantees or other forms of credit enhancements.

## **HUD's Section 3**

Requires certain recipients of certain HUD financial assistance (i.e. Public Housing Authorities) to provide training, employment, contracting and other economic opportunities to low and very low-income persons, business doing work in those communities, or businesses employing persons from the surrounding communities.


