DALLAS DISTRICT PORTFOLIO BY PROJECT STAGE REMAINING FY 2023 THRU FY 2045





- On August 23, 2023 PEPS, CST, and FIN conducted an E&O Standardization process workshop rolling out the updates to the E&O process and the new E&O tracking module in PS-CAMS
- All 1E change orders identified after September 1st are to be input into the new PS-CAMS E&O module for tracking
- PEPS, CST and FIN, are collaborating to develop an E&O reporting dashboard and cross checking with SiteManager
- This will ensure that each 1E change order is resolved


