# Remember

- **All proposed road and park projects will be constructed without raising the County debt service tax rate.**
- **Added capacity roadway projects and additional park facilities are only funded through bond elections. The yearly county budget is for maintenance only.**

# The Path To Get Here

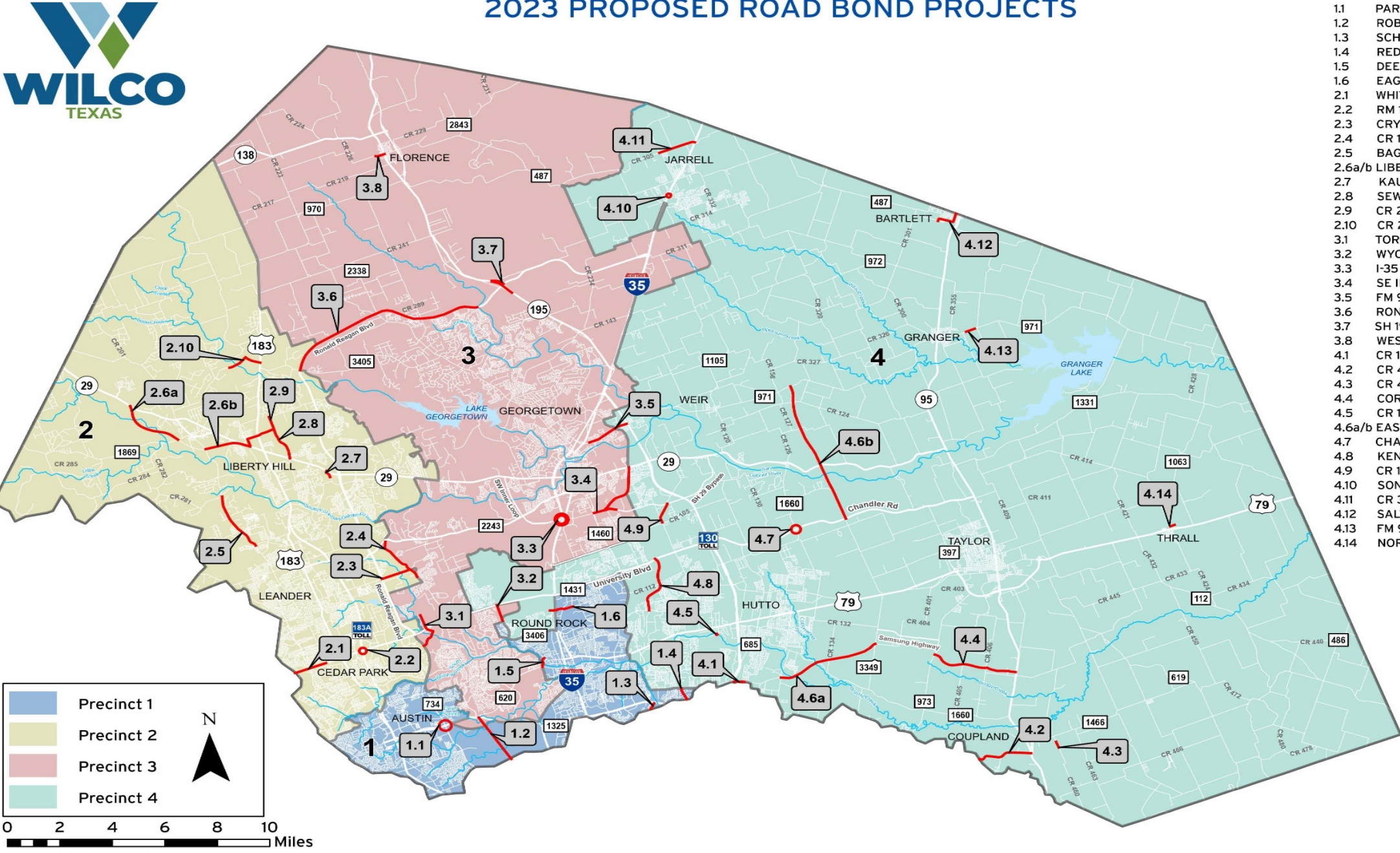
- **March 28, 2023 Williamson County Commissioners Court appoints Citizens Bond Committee**
- **Citizens Bond Committee solicits input from citizens through public meetings held in each precinct**
- **Additionally solicits input from all cities and MUDs**

# The Path To Get Here Continued

- **Citizens Bond Committee receives over \$6 billion in Road Projects and \$127 Million in Park/Trail requests.**
- **Citizens Bond Committee recommended \$1.6862 billion in road projects and \$78.96 million in park projects to the Court.**
- **After consideration, the Court voted to put \$825 million in road projects and \$59 million in park/recreation projects on the November ballot for public consideration.**

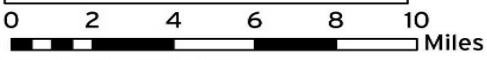

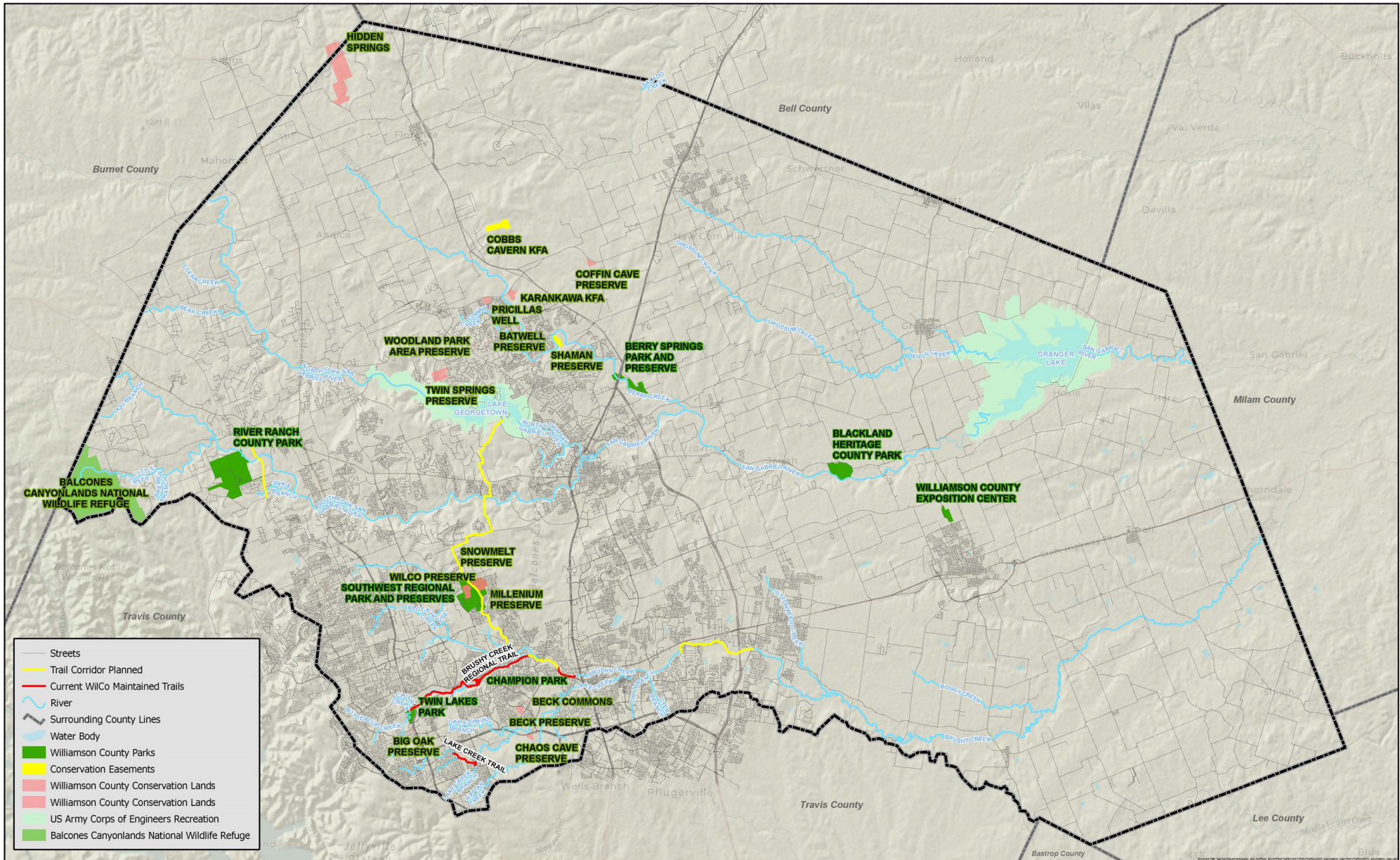

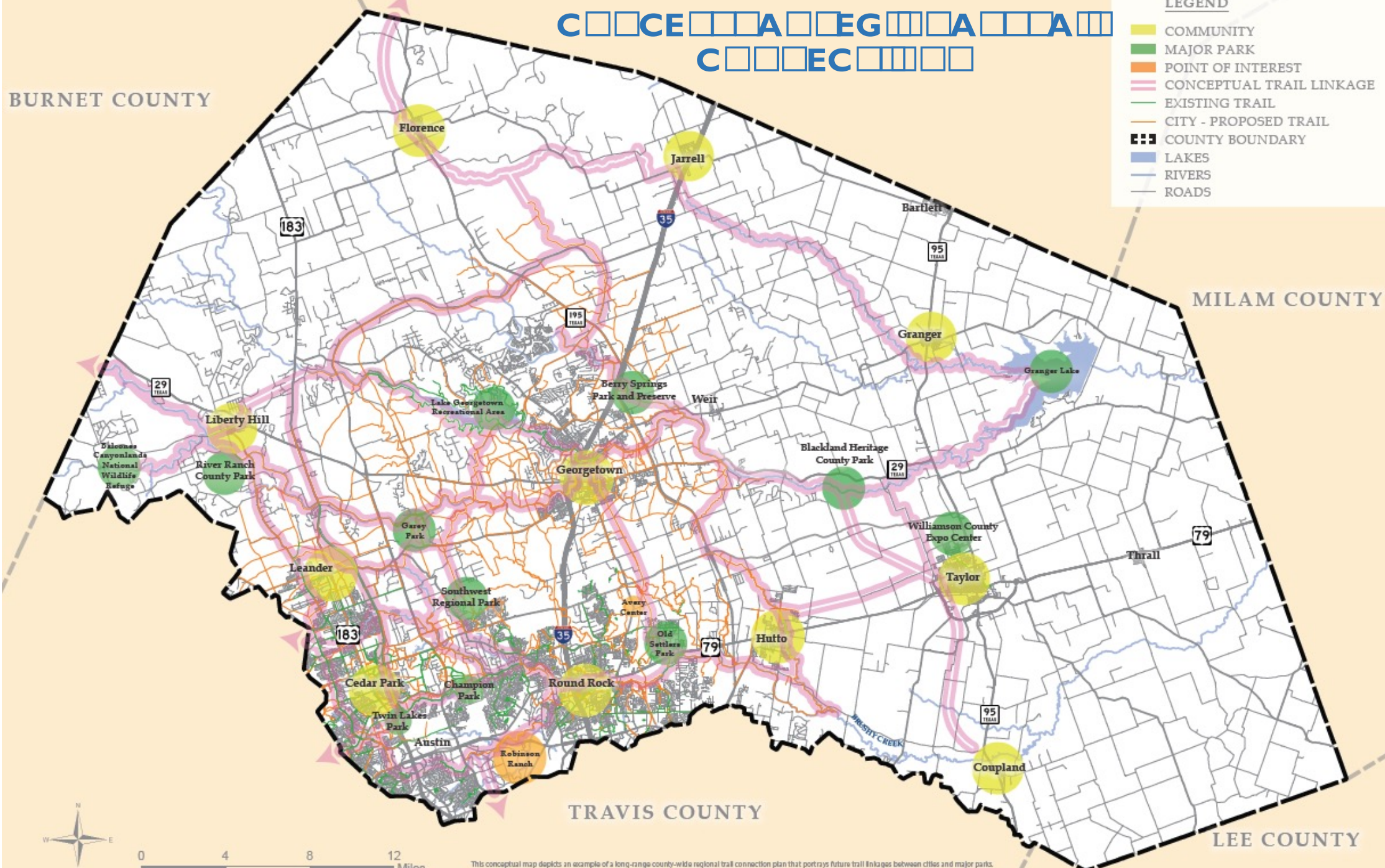

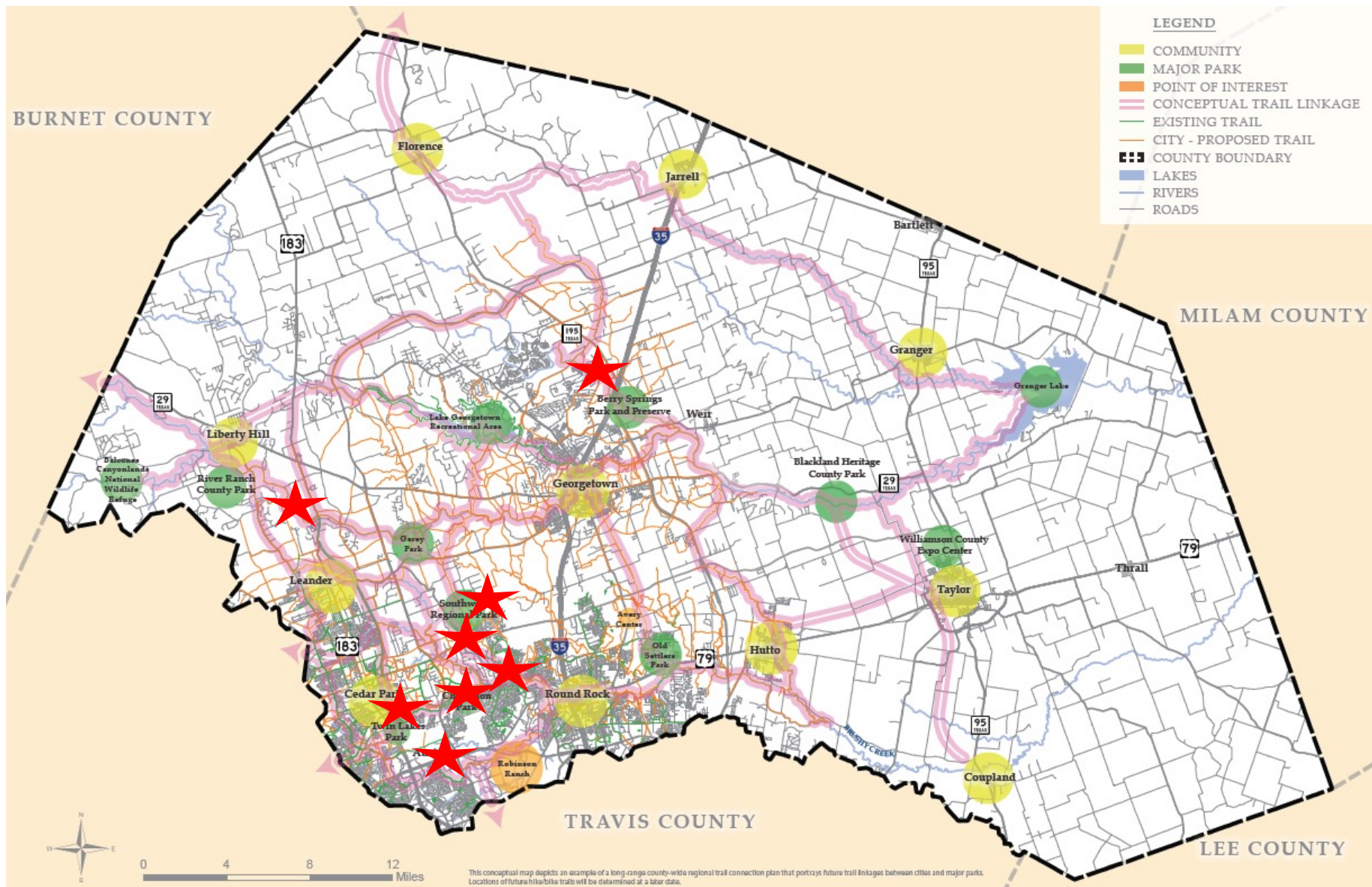

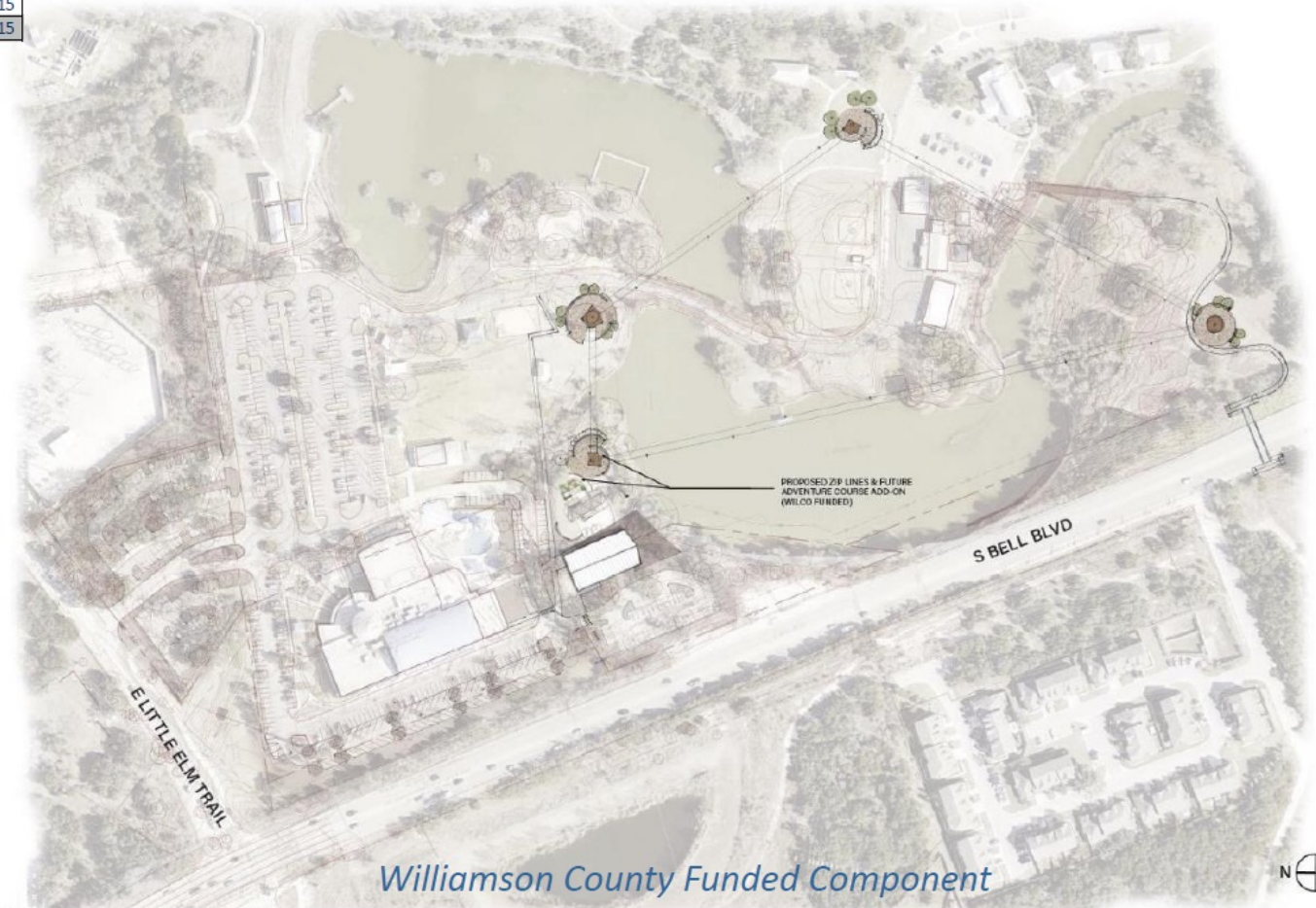

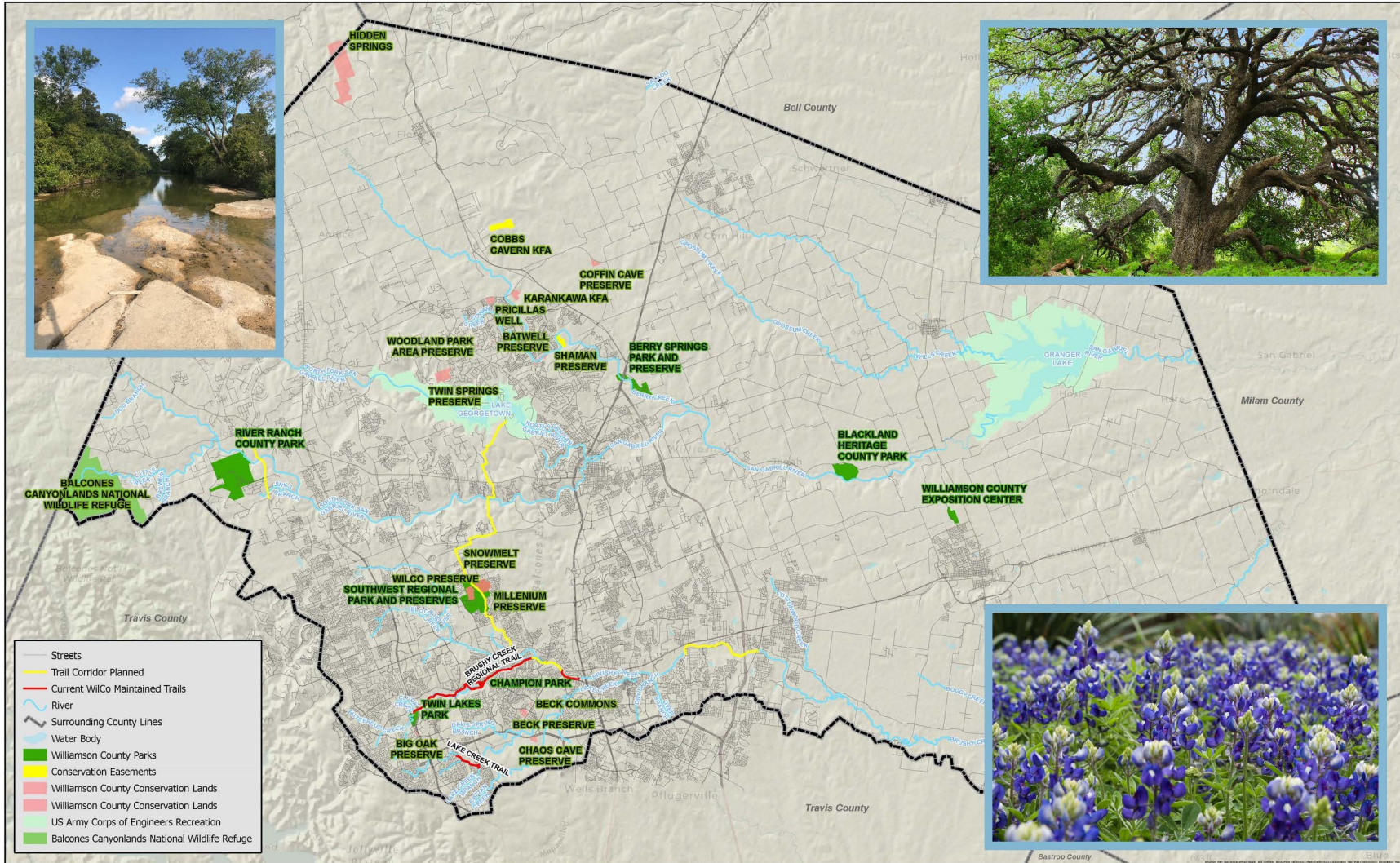
