

Strong U.S. labor market drives record remittances to Mexico with \$55.9 billion in 2022

Strong employment in the **U.S. construction sector**—a leading
employer of Mexican migrants—best
explains the recent growth of
remittances to Mexico.

<u>Via Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas</u> - Mexico is the second-highest receiver of remittances in the world, trailing only India. The payments, mostly from migrants in the U.S., provide a valuable lifeline for millions of Mexican households. They are used mainly for necessities—food, clothing and health care—while they also make up an important part of household expenditures for housing, tuition and debt repayment.



Remittances from the U.S. to Mexico reached a record \$55.9 billion in 2022. These transfers accounted for 95 percent of Mexico's total remittances of \$58.5 billion. Read more.


