FY2025 to FY2027 PEPS Spending



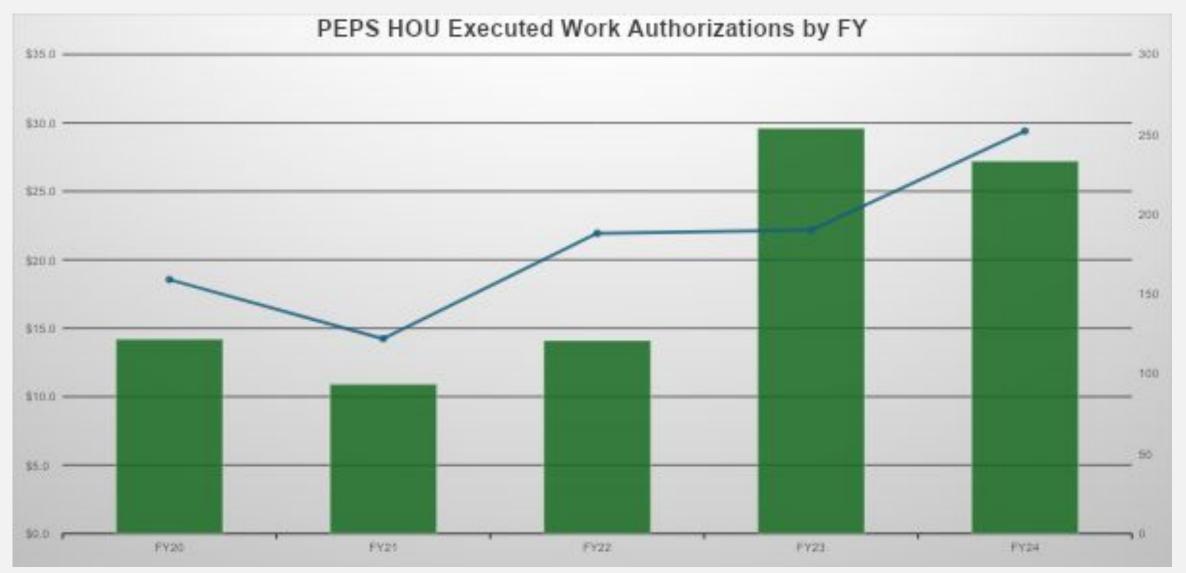




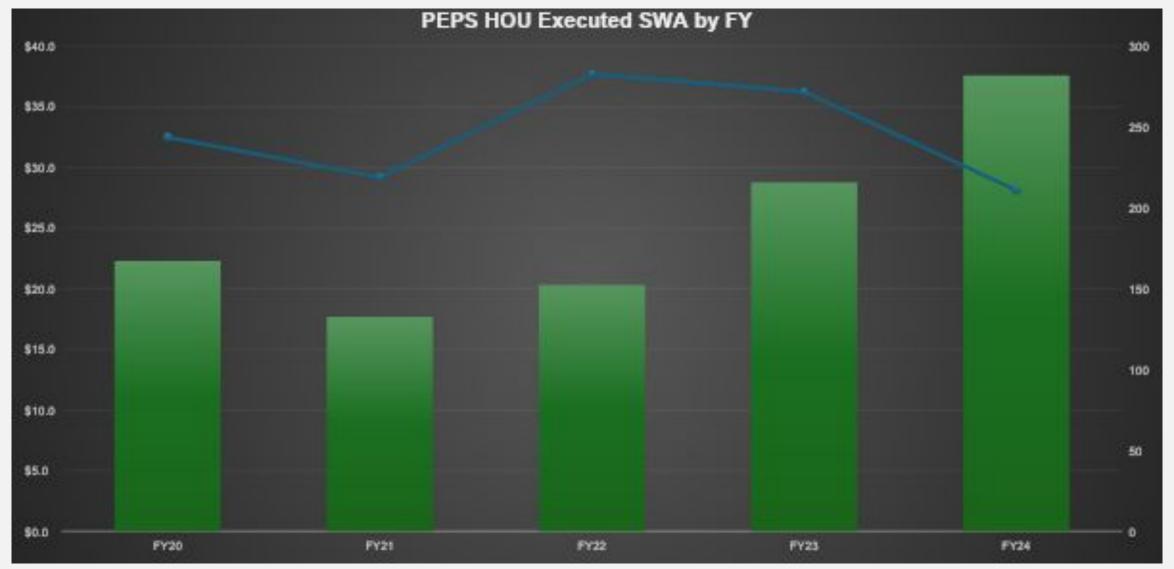


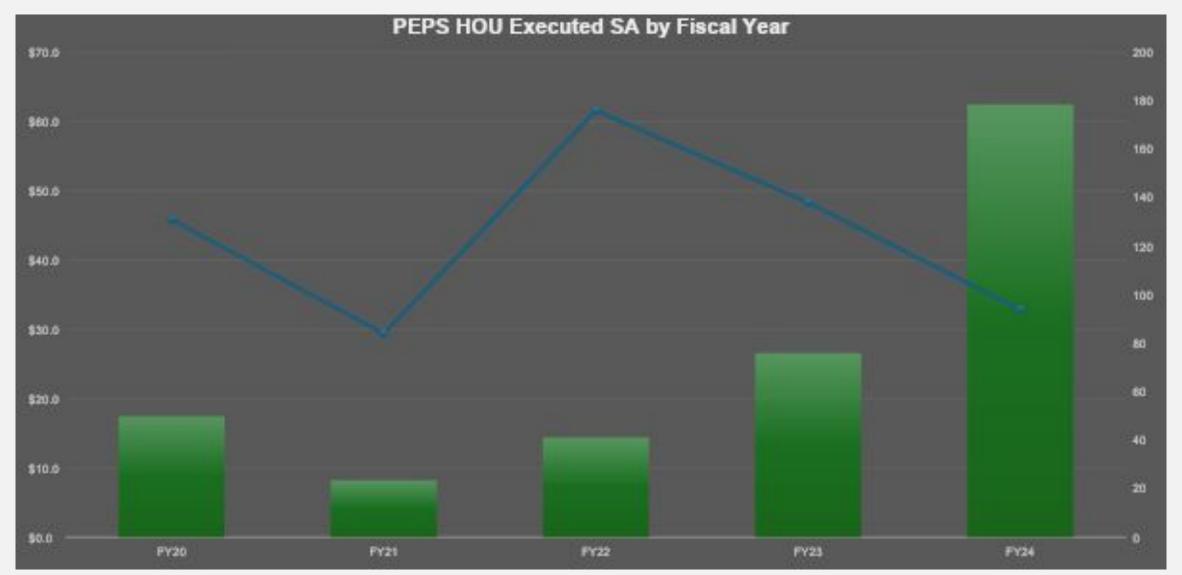












Contract Management

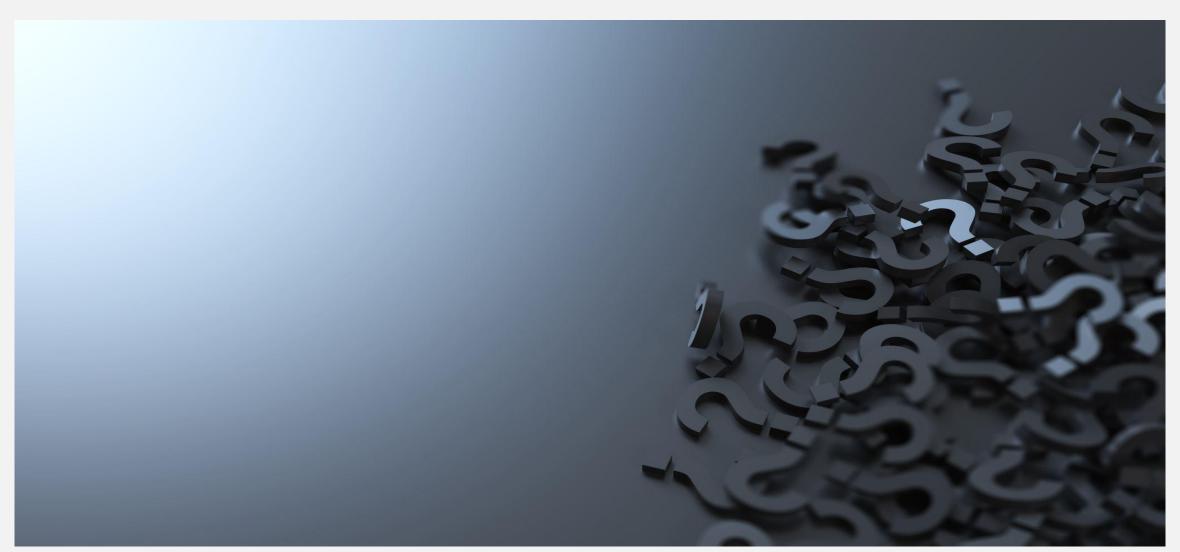
Start work on Work Authorization only after execution

Monitor termination dates for both contract and Work Authorizations

Monitor expenditures

Monitor Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) / Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) commitments on every Contract to ensure goals are met

Send Project Manager (PM) and Service Center Manager (SCM) a written request when changing PM on contract or work authorizations
