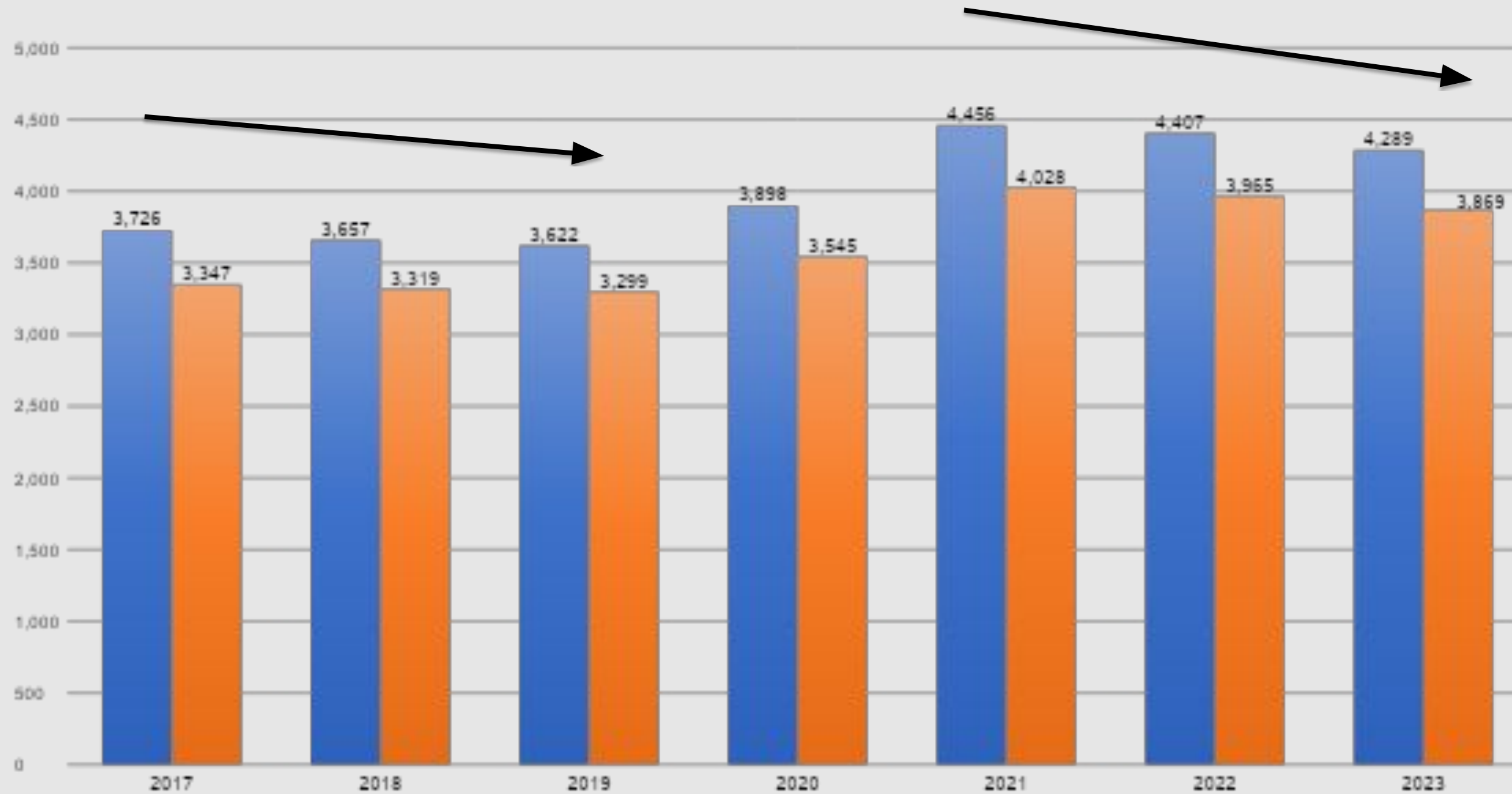

## Texas Fatalities and Fatal Crashes 2017 - 2023

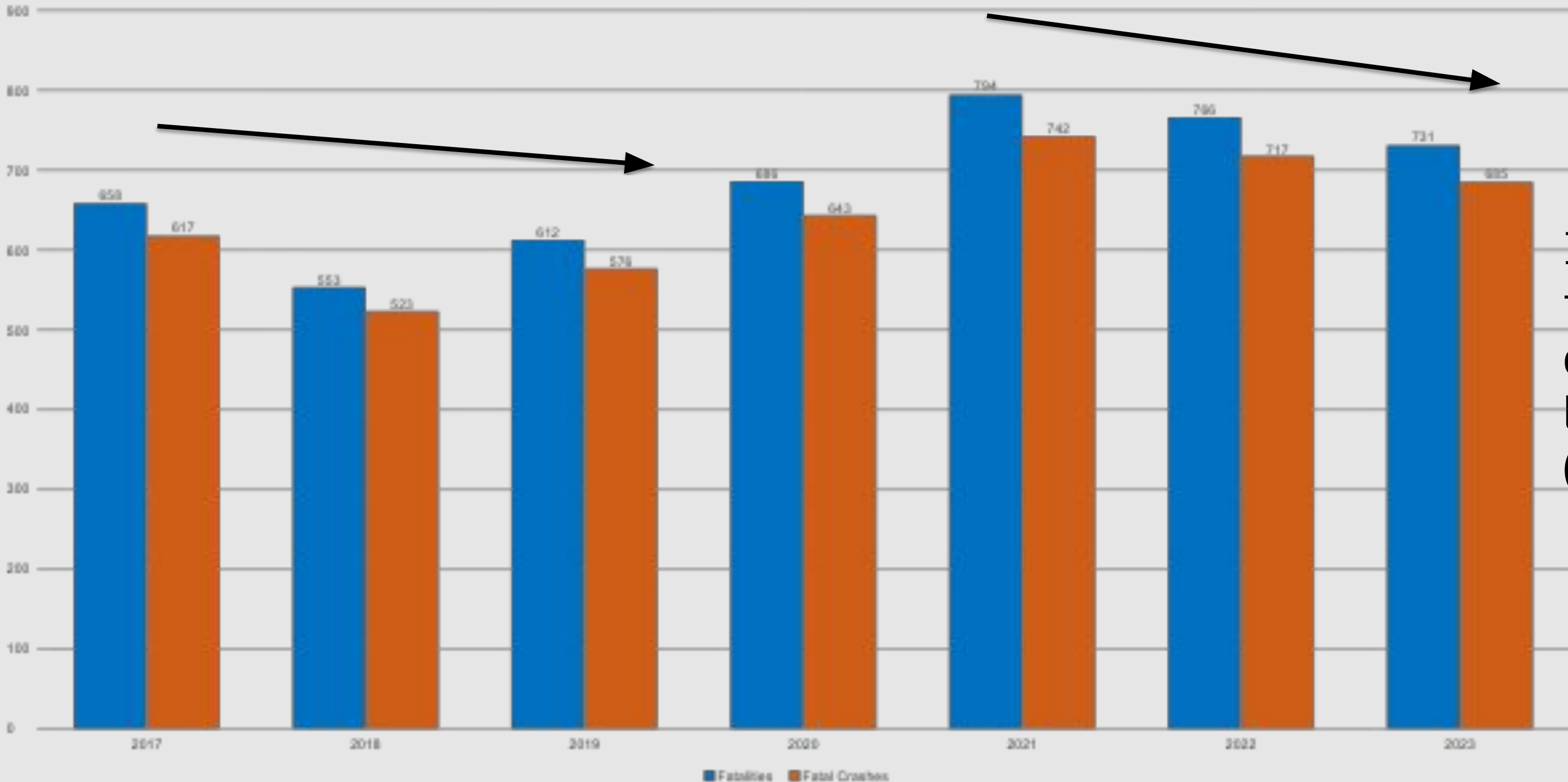


In 2023, traffic-related fatalities were at **4,289** compared with **4,407** lives lost on Texas roadways in 2022 (**▼2.7%**).

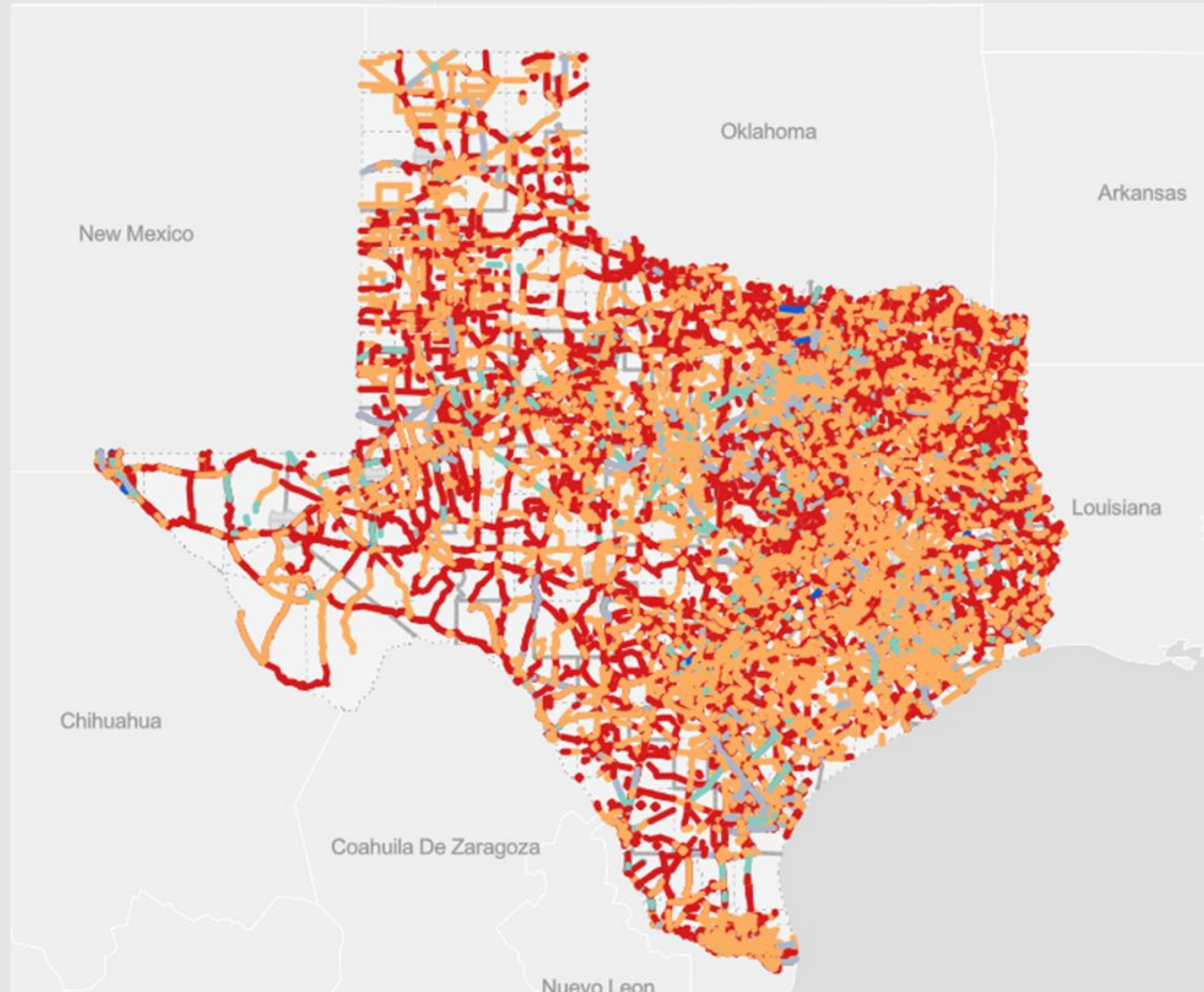

## Fun Facts of the Beaumont District



- The 24-foot, Dalmatian-spotted fire hydrant at the Fire Museum of Texas was donated to the City of Beaumont by Walt Disney on March 9, 1999 for the re-release of the animated movie "101 Dalmatians." Originally the World's Largest Fire Hydrant it weighs over 4,500 pounds.
- Beaumont was the site of the discovery of the Spindletop oil gusher in 1901, which started Texas' first oil boom. Beaumont is also home to the Beaumont Rice Mill, the first commercial rice mill in Texas.
- Port Arthur is the home of football coach, Jimmy Johnson, and American singer and songwriter, Janice Joplin.

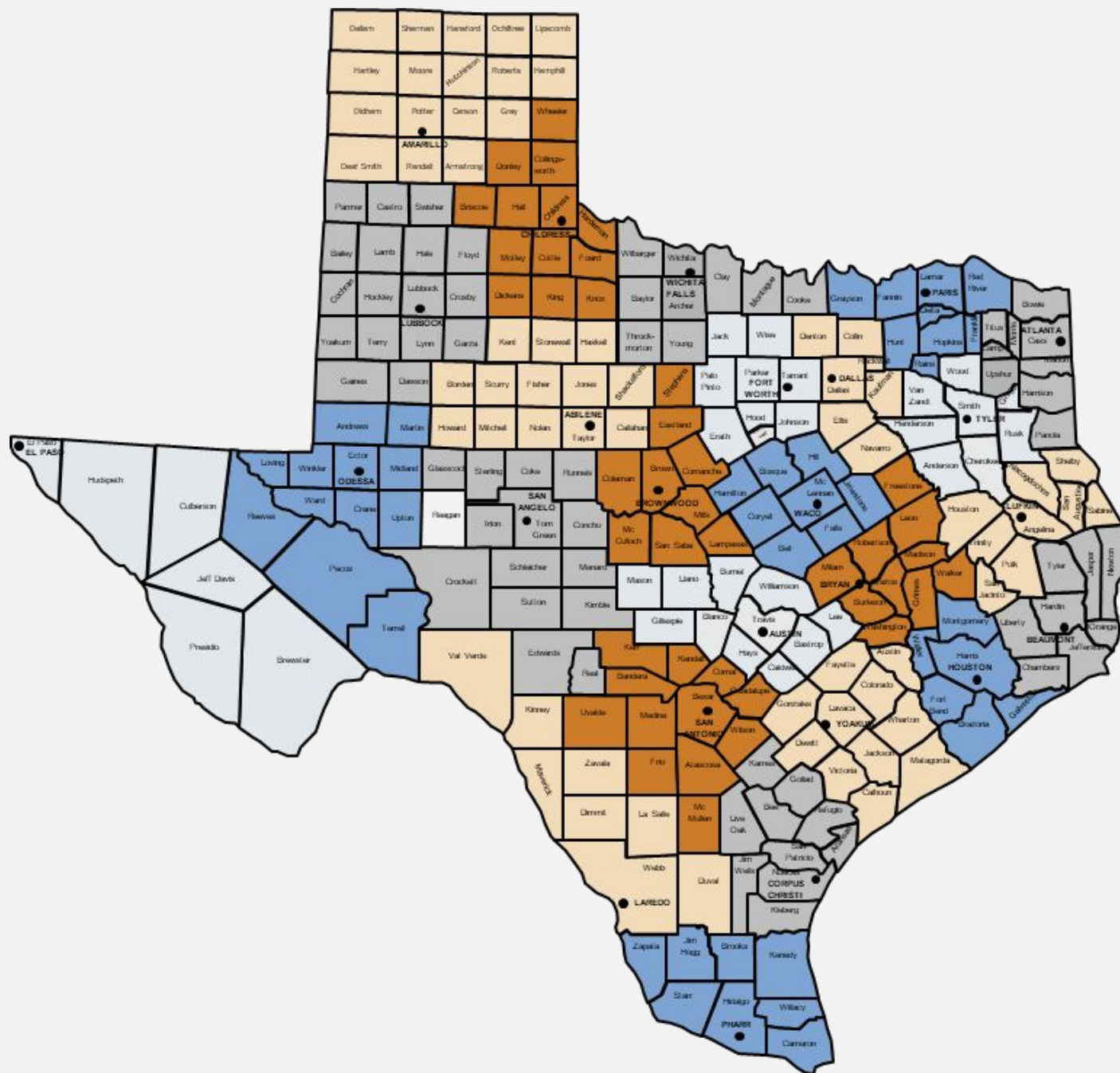

Basics of Design-Build projects and history of TxDOT's Design-Build program.

## One Contract for Design AND Construction



Texas Transportation Code limits program to six projects of \$150M+ in value per state fiscal biennium



TxDOT retains oversight authority to ensure design-build contract obligations are met



Design-Builder is contractually required to meet schedule and quality requirements



Selection of Design-Builder is a 2-step best-value approach:

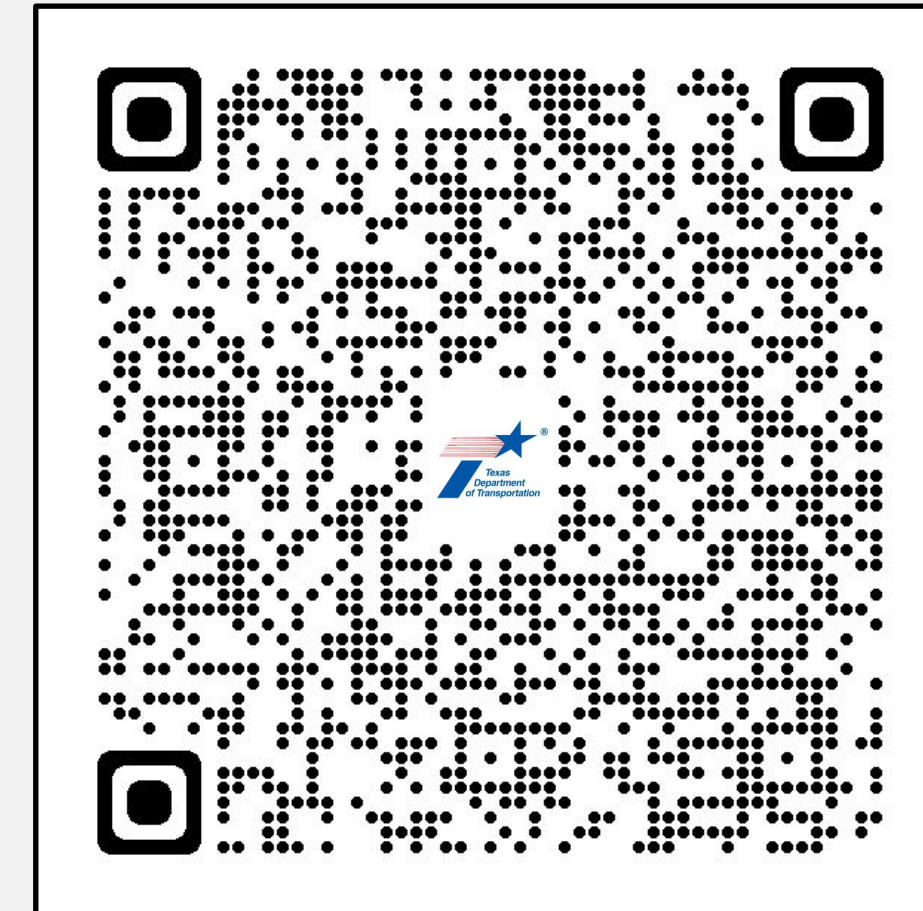
